eonte was 29 months old when he began speech services with Life Steps Foundation. When we first saw him, he would only point to objects and toys to request them, follow one step instructions, make eye contact with whoever called his name, and occasionally make sounds during play.

To provide Deonte with more tools of communication, the early interventionists taught him some sign language. They started off by signing "more", "please", and "help". Deonte would pull his hands away quickly, cry, and reach for the toys he wanted. However, as the weeks passed, Deonte became comfortable when prompted to sign and waited until we completed each sign to take a toy. He also started vocalizing during play and imitating vehicle and animal sounds. Deonte turned 3 years old in January, 2024, and the program staff couldn't be prouder of all the progress he made. Now, Deonte consistently uses two- to three-word phrases, sings songs, and is practicing combining phrases. His determination, patience, and enthusiasm made working with Deonte a delightful experience. We all wish him and his family the very best in everything they do.

LSF Northern California Children and Family Services Grow With Me Program Update

ife Steps Foundation's Grow With Me virtual playgroup is in its fourth year. The group is a safe space to educate parents about child development, model age-appropriate activities, and provide individualized resources and support to each family. We support new families by connecting them to other families with children of similar ages.

We consider our Grow With Me playgroups a success when we have families who continue to join and participate in multiple sessions. For example, we have a family who joined our first ever Infant Group with their son. The family shared that their primary reason for joining Grow With Me was for socialization opportunities for both mother and son. We had the opportunity to watch this first-time mother and her son learn and grow over the course of the group meetings. They continued to participate each progressing group, as it was appropriate for their son's age, all the way through our Preschool Group. This allowed the mother to ask meaningful questions and share stories, challenges, and triumphs. What stood out to her especially was learning about development and gaining some ideas of activities she could do with her son. These activities, especially through song, helped to address the son's gross motor and expressive language development. The mother shared that she enjoyed learning new songs and activities that were modeled during the group.

The family also found the resources provided through the group to be particularly helpful. Some resources we offer are within the group, such as PowerPoint presentations and the "Warm Line" we offer. We also connect families to resources within their community that they can tap into to assist with their child's development. These resources helped the family address some of the son's challenging behaviors and provided the support the family needed while learning how to best encourage their son. By connecting the family to early interventionists and referring them to



local community resources, Grow With Me was able to create a safe space where both mother and son were fully supported. We were then able to help them find an appropriate day care for their son when he was ready to go to school.

In 2024, this family welcomed a newborn daughter and joined the Infant Group again where they were able to ask questions, socialize with other parents, and focus on her daughter's development. This time, both mother and father participated in this Infant Group and attended every session despite their work schedules, being sleep deprived with an infant and a toddler and balancing the needs of two children during the group. We were able to support both infant and toddler with their development regardless of what stage they were at developmentally and what their journey looked like.

This family's commitment to this program and desire to learn how to support their young children has been beautiful to witness. We have seen the progress over the years in their son's development, as he has grown and shown increased confidence in all he does. It has been a joy to watch them navigate the challenges and celebrations of parenthood as they learn how to best support their newest daughter. This family has a true desire to learn, grow, and be the best parents they can be for their children.
