ameson and Maverick, a set of twins, began receiving speech and early intervention services with us at the age of one. As they approached preschool age, we had to find a creative solution to provide them with one-onone services without causing any distress. By coordinating the schedules of their speech and Child Development Specialist (CDS) providers, we were able to arrange in-home sessions where each child received individual attention while the other played and engaged with the other provider. This approach kept both boys interested and involved in their services. The support and involvement of their parents and older siblings played a crucial role in their progress. In April of the previous year, they turned three, they aged out of our program, transitioning to school-based services if needed. However, we still occasionally receive

updates from their mom, which we always cherish. The twins had speech delays and general global delays, and our aim was to help them reach their developmental milestones, ensuring they were prepared for their next educational journey.
